HELPING KIDS LEARN THE WOD IS SIMPLE FIND IT, SPEAK IT, SHOW IT.

- Introduce the WOD to kids you work with or see.
- Ask them if they know the WOD, use their answers to define it and use it in a sentence.
- Ask them how many different meanings they can think of for the word on Multiple Meaning Mondays.
- Post the WOD or WOD Calendar on your blackboards, bulletin boards, marquees, storefront windows, reception desks, Facebook pages, websites.
- Talk it up with everyone!
